SAT and ACT

- Begin taking these tests in the spring of your Junior year.
- Use the code 9999 when registering for these tests and reporting scores. This code will send results directly to the clearinghouse. Scores **MUST** come directly from the testing companies.

When to Apply...

- Register online at the end of your Junior year using the NCAA Clearinghouse website: www.ncaaclearinghouse.net

How to Apply...

- Once on the Clearinghouse website, click on the Domestic Records Release Form and fill out all required information
- Print out both copies, sign it (or have a parent sign if under 18 years of age), and return both copies to your guidance counselor.

Absegami's Role...

- Once both signed copies of the Domestic Records Release Form are received, the Guidance Department will forward along Copy 1 with an official transcript to establish initial eligibility.
- Once the student graduates, we will forward Copy 2 along with a final official transcript.

Student's Role...

- Communicate your future plans with your guidance counselor so appropriate classes can be scheduled.
- Be a STUDENT 1st and an ATHLETE 2nd

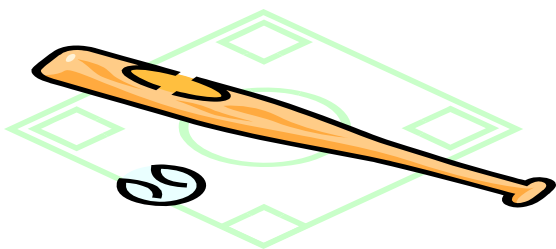
Clearing the Clearinghouse

If you are an athlete that is considering playing at the Division I or II level, you must apply and be cleared by the NCAA Clearinghouse before you will be allowed to participate with your college team. The Clearinghouse is in place to ensure that future college athletes meet certain academic criteria which are outlined in this brochure. The time to start preparing for the future is NOW!!!

What criteria does the NCAA Clearinghouse use to clear student athletes?

There are **four** parts to eligibility as put forth by the NCAA.

1. **Graduation from High School** ~ meeting all the NJ requirements. Contact the guidance department or see Student Agenda Book for specific requirements.
2. **Minimum Core Course Grade Point Avg.** ~ GPA for the Clearinghouse is calculated using Core Courses ONLY
3. **Minimum ACT or SAT test scores** ~ Div I & II have different standards
4. **Completion of 16 Core Courses** ~ A core course is a college prep/honors/AP class that qualifies for graduation credit in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Non-doctrinal Religion and Philosophy.



DIVISION I CORE COURSE REQUIREMENTS

16 Core Course Academic Units

- 4 Years of English
- 3 Years of Math ~ Algebra I and higher
- 2 Years of Science ~ one must be a lab
* 4 Year colleges require 2 Lab Sciences
- 1 Year of additional English, Math, or Science
- 2 Years of Social Studies
- 4 Years of Additional Core Course Academic Units
* Additional courses must be CP/Honors/AP level in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Non-doctrinal religion, Philosophy, or Foreign Language

- This Eligibility Index works in combination with the core course requirements.

Core GPA	SAT (includes math & critical reading ONLY)	ACT (sum of scores)
3.550	400	37
3.000	620	52
2.250	920	77
2.000	1010	86

Here's how it works

- A student with a 3.550 must have scored at least 400 on the SAT as well as met all other core course academic unit requirements
- The scale slides down incrementally to a minimum GPA of 2.0 plus a SAT score of 1010 or

DIVISION II CORE COURSE REQUIREMENTS

14 Core Course Academic Units

- 3 Years of English
- 2 Years of Math ~ Algebra I and higher
- 2 Years of Science ~ one must be a lab
* 4 Year colleges require 2 Lab Sciences
- 2 Years of Social Studies
- 2 Years of additional English, Math, or Science
- 3 Years of Additional Core Course Academic Units
* Additional courses must be CP/Honors/AP level in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Non-doctrinal religion, Philosophy, or Foreign Language

DIVISION II SAT/ACT & GPA REQUIREMENTS

- Students must have at least a 2.00 Core Course Grade Point Average **PLUS** at least a SAT score of 820 or ACT score of 68 (sum of all scores)

DIVISION III REQUIREMENTS

- Div III colleges and universities DO NOT require you to apply to the Clearinghouse

JUNIOR COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

- Junior colleges DO NOT require you to apply to the Clearinghouse
