



New Score Choice™ Resources for You and Your Students

With the launch of Score Choice™ just around the corner (March 2009), we want to make sure you have all the information you need to help your students and their parents understand this new feature. Score Choice gives students the opportunity to select which scores they send to colleges by test date for the SAT® and by individual test for SAT Subject Tests™—in accordance with a college or university's score-use practice.

Each college, university and scholarship program has different score-use practices. To help students understand how institutions use scores, the College Board has developed an easy-to-use, student-friendly system that will display the score-use practices of participating institutions to students when they register for the test on collegeboard.com or when they order additional score reports. Colleges and universities will only receive the scores that students choose to send them, and scores will not be released against students' wishes. Students who have not reported scores to any institutions will receive special e-mail reminders when traditional score-submission deadlines approach.

Score Choice is optional, and if a student does not actively decide to use it, all his or her scores will be sent automatically. For students who are unsure of which scores to send, we recommend that they send all their scores.
